### IMPROVEMENT IN HOISTING DEVICE FOR TRUCKS.

The Schedule Referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known, that I, NATHAN ALBERTSON, of Plainfield, in the county of Hendricks, and State of Indiana, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Hoisting Device for Trucks; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable those skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification, in which :

Figure 1 is a side sectional elevation, showing my improved hoisting device attached to a high wheel truck.

Figure 2 a view of the invention detached.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

This invention relates to a new and useful improvement in a device for raising logs, rocks, or other heavy objects to be moved on a truck, and consists in a sliding verticle ratchet operated by a lever for raising a log, or other weight, attached by degrees, and a spring-dog of peculiar construction, for catching the ratchet and holding it securely at any desired point of elevation, as hereinafter more particularly described.

A represents a pair of high truck-wheels, such as are commonly used for hauling logs, stone, and other heavy articles, which are hung under the truck, and raised enough to clear the ground freely. B is the axle, upon which, over the reach C, is secured a strong block, D. An iron ratchet, E, is fitted to slide up and down in the block D, to be raised by means of a cross-bar or hand lever, F, the point of which catches in one of the ratchet-teeth while bearing on a fulcrum, *a*. A dog, *b*, connected with a spring, *c*, engages the ratchet, and holds it, when raised, at any desired elevation for lifting the log or other article from the ground when attached by tongs, *d*, in the usual way, as shown in figure 1. The dog, *b*, is provided with a handle, *e*, by which it readily disengages the ratchet to lower the weight attached.

Having described my invention I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent:

The vertical rack E operated by the lever F, in combination with the spring-dog, *b*, when attached to a truck constructed, arranged, and operating as and for the purpose described.


