Item, I do give and bequeath to Mary M and Aaron my two oldest children the South half of the north west quarter of section thirty six, range one east and Township fifteen north of the lands offered for sale at Crawfordville to them and their heirs forever to be held as joint-tenants and not as tenants in common with right of survivorship should either the said Mary M or Aaron Decease first, without issue.

Item, I do give and bequeath to Harriet and Amos my two youngest children the east half of the south west quarter of section twenty five range one east, township fifteen north of the lands offered for sale at Crawfordville to them and their heirs forever to be held as joint tenants and not as tenants at common with right of survivorship should either the said Harriet or Amos die first without issue.

Item, I do give and bequeath to my brother John Alderson the full and free use and occupation of the north west quarter of section thirty six range one east township fifteen north for and during the space of two years, in consideration of a verbal contract entered into betwixt us to cultivate the said land upon shares each to furnish equal labor, reserving to my wife Phoebe the use of the house and garden.

Item. I do also give and bequeath the balance of my personal property after the payment of all my just <sup>debts</sup>, to my four children to be equally divided amongst them, giving to Mary M. the right of choice of the bed and furniture that formerly belonged to her dear mother.
