Answer I expect to be in the state of Kentucky.

Ques. 3^d State whether you were acquainted with Sarah C. Alexander deceased. If you were how long were you acquainted with her -

Answer I was acquainted with her ever since I have been old enough to remember any one.

Ques. 4th State where, if you knew, said Sarah C. Alexander, deceased, made her home, & during the last ten years of her life.

Answer She made her home with Darius Leachman, the plaintiff.

Ques. 5th State what you know, if any thing, during

the last ten years of her life, of the state and condition of her health and physical condition.

Answer. She was an invalid. She was confined to her bed much of the time.

Ques. 5th State what, if you know, was the profession of the plaintiff during the last ten years, of the life of said Sarah C. Alexander —

Answer. He was a physician.

Ques. 6th State, if you know, whether he acted as the physician of said Sarah during that time —

Answer. I have heard her say, ^{he} ~~she~~ was. She told me she preferred him to any one else.

Ques. 7th State ~~if~~ whether said Sarah spent any of the last ten years of her life at your house —

Answer. She spent about one year and nine months of that time at my house. During that time she was under the medical care and treatment of the plaintiff —
