John Harvey, Executor
of the Last Will and Testament of Harris
Almond, deceased, complains of the defend-
ants and says: that Harris Almond died testate
in the County of Hendricks and State of Indiana
on the 28th day of February 1895, leaving as his
heirs at law and only heirs the defendants
Pleasant Almond, Jane Brown and John K.
Almond, and his wife Parthenia Almond;
that the defendants herein are the sons and
daughter of said decedent, and his wife Parthenia
Almond, to whom was devised a life estate in
certain real estate of said decedent, and \$500.⁰⁰
in money, survived the said Harris Almond
only eighteen hours.

That the personal estate of said Harris Almond
that has come into his hands, as shown by the
Inventory filed herein on the 5th day of April 1895,
amounts to the sum of \$414.⁰⁰, but that among
the assets so appraised was one note on Perry
R. Tully, appraised at the sum of \$80.⁷⁴; that the
said Tully is notoriously insolvent, and nothing
can be realized on said note of said Tully, so
that the actual appraised value of the personal
estate amounts to the sum of \$333.²⁶.

The Executor also shows that the indebtedness of said estate, so far as the same has come to his knowledge is as follows:-

children, and his wife, Parthenia Almond, now deceased.

That at the time of the death of said Harris Almond he was
the owner in fee of the following described real estate in Hendricks
County and State of Indiana, to-wit: the South half of the South East
quarter of section twenty five (25) in Township fifteen (15) North and
range one (1) East, containing eighty (80) acres more or less.

That by the will of said Harris Almond said real estate was devised to these defendants as a residuary devise.

That the appraised value of the personal estate of said decedent is three hundred and thirty six dollars and thirty six cents, and that said executor has collected on a claim against the estate of Theophilus Almond the sum of \$ 328⁶⁷ making a personal estate of \$ 665.03

The defendants John K. Almond and Jane Brown, for answer to the petition of the Executor herein for the sale of real estate say,

1st. That they deny that there is any indebtedness of said estate, including expense of administration, in excess of the amount of the personal estate of said decedent.

2nd. And for further answer herein to the petition of the executor for the sale of real estate said defendants say,

That the personal estate of said decedent as shown by the inventory and sale bill ^{of} said estate on file in this court amounts to the sum of \$475. That said executor has collected on a claim against the estate of Theophilus Almond deceased the sum of \$328.67 not appraised in the inventory, making a total of personal assets which have come to the hands of said executor \$800. and in addition thereto there are several other notes due said estate on which large sums could be realized, but which the executor has made no effort to collect. Which personal estate is

sufficient to pay all the debts against said estate for which the same is primarily liable including the costs and expenses of administration.

And said defendants further say, that the claim of John M. Carter allowed by the Court on recommendation of the executor against said estate in the sum of \$355.60 is on two notes executed by defendant Pleasant Almond, who was principal, and by said testator as surety, and that no part of the consideration of said notes was received by said testator ~~or~~ for his benefit, all of which was known to the Executor at the time of making said allowances.

That the claim of John M. Carter administrator of the estate of John T. Strong deceased, allowed by the executor herein at the sum of \$1216.93 was the amount of principal, interest and attorney's fees due on a note of said Pleasant Almond, on which the testator Harris Almond was surety and no part of the consideration therefor was received by said testator, which facts were made known to the executor herein at the time of his making said allowances. And they further say, that the said claims so filed do not, nor does either of them allege the insolvency of Pleasant Almond, the principal, or that he is a non resident of the State of Indiana or that the claimants had made efforts to collect the same by law from said principal and had been unable to do so, nor did said executor make a provisional allowance of said ~~said~~ claims or either of them.

And these defendants further aver that Pleasant Almond, the principal in said notes is the owner of a large amount of personal property of the value of \$1000. and is the owner of real

estate of the value of \$4000. above all incumbrances and both of said claims can be collected from his said property and save the estate of said Harris Almond deceased, harmless on account of the same.

Wherefore they say that the prayer of the petition herein should not be granted, but that the same should be dismissed, and they pray judgment.
