arrested, & indicted, tried and ~~convicted~~
acquitted for the murder of my
father, William Ayres, My ~~xxx~~
mother, Mary Ayres, and my bro,
Chas. C. Ayres, were arrested with me
but they were discharged on their
preliminary examination, A few
days after father's death, I heard
a conversation between the plaintiff,
J. H. Johnson, and Mary Ayres, the
decedent; the conversation was at
our house, ~~My~~ Johnson told mother
that she ought to have an attorney,
she said that she wanted him, to act
as such, to assist in the defense, that
he might consider himself employed,
she wanted him to assist in hunting
up evidence, My mother asked Mr.
Johnson, what his fee would be,
Mr. Johnson said that he would charge
her two hundred dollars (\$200), if
she would pay it soon, and if not he
would charge her two hundred and
fifty ~~(\$250.00)~~ dollars.

I heard mother say that she employed
Mr. Johnson, so that ~~he~~ would not be
employed on the other side,

The next conversation I heard between Plaintiff and my mother, Mary Ayers, ~~was~~ on the subject was in the jail a few days before my trial in the Circuit Court. The conversation was the same in substance that I have just related, that Mr. Johnson was to assist in my trial, his duty being to hunt up evidence, and look after witnesses getting to court, and she would pay him ~~the amount~~ two hundred dollars. The next conversation I heard between them on this same subject was at Mr. Johnson's house in Brownsville on the evening after my acquittal. Mr. Johnson and I went around by Indianapolis on the train, Squire Osborn and mother went through in a sleigh. We took supper at Mr. Johnson's, I heard my mother tell Mr. Johnson, that she would pay him in a few days for his services; that the amount previously agreed upon was two hundred (200) dollars, and that if she could not pay it in a short time she would give him her note for two hundred and fifty dollars. Squire Osborn was

present and heard the conversation,
Mother stated to Mr. Johnson that she
was well satisfied with his services.
The conversation occurred as we
were starting home, &

I heard mother speak frequently
after the trial that she owed Mr.
Johnson two hundred dollars, and that
she must pay it - or she would have
to give her note ^{to him} for two hundred and
fifty dollars. Don't think it was ever
paid, in fact - I know it was
not. Mother died rather suddenly in
about one month after my trial.

Mr. Johnson is my guardian and
was at the time of my trial.

My sister Bernice Ayers boarded seven
weeks with Mr. Johnson, and went to
school. It is worth \$250 to \$3.00 per week.
The defense admitted the item at
\$250 per week for seven weeks.

Squire Osborn, being duly sworn testified
as follows:-

I am acquainted with the decedent,
Mary Ayers, have known her for
several years. Know the plaintiff
J. H. Johnson, He resides in Browns-
burg, Mrs. Ayers resided about a
mile of Brownsburg, I resided
near Mrs. Ayers during her lifetime,
did not live in the neighborhood at
the time of her husband's death,
came to the neighborhood, I think
it was about the first of December
1878, worked for Mrs. Ayers, almost
constantly from that time till
her death, which ^{I think} was in February 1879.
I was about her house a great deal.

The first conversation I heard
between Mrs. Ayers and Mr. Johnson
in regard to the matter in suit, was
at her house, a short time before
her son, Gardner's trial.

Mrs. Ayers asked Mr. Johnson
for two hundred (200) dollars to
pay Mr. Campbell and Burns on
their fee, as Atty's for defending
Gardner, Mr. Johnson requested her
to pay him the two hundred (200)

dollars, and let Mr. Campbell and
Burrus wait a while longer for ~~the~~
their fee, as he needed his money
worse than they, Mrs. Ayres replied that
she ~~needed~~ would pay Mr. Johnson his
two hundred dollars in a short time,
but if she could not pay it soon,
she would give him her note for
two hundred and fifty dollars.

That is about all I remember
of the conversation,
if Mr. Johnson was at that time
the Administrator of her husband's
estate.

The next conversation I heard
between them in regard to the matter
was at Mr. Johnson's house, on
the evening after Burdett's trial.

Mrs. Ayres told Mr. Johnson that
she would pay him his money
soon, that it was to be two hundred
dollars if paid down, but if she could
not pay him in a short time she
would give her note for two hundred
and fifty dollars.

I often heard Mrs. Ayres after
that speak of owing Johnson two

hundred dollars, and that she
must pay it. Heard her speak of
Mr. Johnson procuring witnesses
for Gardner, said that he friend
Mrs. Patterson, Mrs. Watts and
son.

John Strong first being duly sworn
testified as follows:

I am acquainted with Mr.
Johnson, the plaintiff, knew Mrs.
Ayer in her lifetime, worked for
her a great deal after her husband's
death, worked for her until her
death, I heard a conversation
between Mrs. Ayer and Mr.
Johnson, at Mrs. Ayer house, a
short time before the trial of
Gardner in this court. They were
talking about Gardner's trial,
During the conversation Mrs.
Ayer told Mr. Johnson, that she

would pay him his money in a short time, and if she did not, she would give him her note for two hundred and fifty dollars,

(I heard her say after Sargent's trial that Mr. Johnson procured witnesses for Sargent,) X

I frequently heard Mrs. Ayer refer to the matter in the family,

Say that she owed Mr. Johnson two hundred dollars, I heard her tell Sargent that he ought to help her pay Mr. Johnson, and he said he would

And here the plaintiff rested,

Defendants evidence: -

And the defendant, to support the issue on his part, introduced the following evidence,

L. M. Campbell, being duly sworn testified as follows: -

I am acquainted with the plaintiff J. H. Johnson, knew the deceased, Mary Ayer, during her lifetime. I, in connection with Mr. Burns, defended Gardner Ayer on the charge of murdering his father. I never knew or had any intimation either from Gardner or his mother that Mr. Johnson was employed in the case. He rendered no assistance to my knowledge. I managed the trial and Mr. Burns presented the evidence. As the neighborhood in which defendant is usually before the court ^{resides} ^{resided}, I felt the need of some one in the neighborhood to procure witnesses and perform such other duties as it ^{is necessary} to be done in all such cases in the neighborhood of defendant. On my suggestion that duty was given to Mr. Burns, as he resides in Brunswick in defendant's neighborhood. Mr. Burns agreed with them in regard to our fee.

* Report of Johnson as above - showing credits claimed for payments to Mrs Ayers and her receipts (here insert) also following notes (here copy notes of Mrs Ayers to Johnson as above)

I knew Mr. Johnson was taking some interest in the case, knew of him looking after witnesses, but did not know that he was engaged in the case as an attorney. Johnson was the guardian of the defendant and I expressed myself that he ought to take more interest than he did in the case. I did not tell him that it was his duty to assist what he could in Gardner's defense.

The only assistance I had by any attorney in the defense of Gardner Ayers was rendered by Mr Burns.

I knew that Mrs Ayers had had some talk with Mr Johnson about the defense of herself and sons before they were arrested but after the arrest I know she employed myself and Mr Burns and that we did all the professional service that was rendered to my knowledge, and Mr Burns made the contract with her for atty fees and she gave her notes for the amount at the time of the employment. Mr Johnson was not with us at the trial, nor at any consultation we ever had and never told me that he was employed in the case.

Whereupon the court called the
plaintiff J. H. Johnson who being
duly sworn testified as follows,
My name is J. H. Johnson, and
the plaintiff in this action, My
business is that of an attorney,
and reside at Brownsville,
I knew Mary Ayer, the deceased,
A few days after the killing of
William Ayer by Gardner Ayer,
his son, Mary Ayer employed
me to assist in the defense of
her son Gardner Ayer for killing
his father, She said there was
going to be trouble, some of her
neighbors said he had killed him
on purpose, and not accidental,
She told me to look after the case
procure witnesses, and converse
with them and find out what they
would swear to, and that I might
consider myself employed, She
asked what I would charge, I
told her two hundred dollars
(\$200.00) if paid before, if I had to
wait for the money I would
charge her two hundred and
fifty dollars, She said she would

pay me the two hundred dollars,
but if she could not pay it soon
she would give her note for two
hundred and fifty dollars, I
worked on the case from that time
on, counseled her on the case several
times, Talked with witnesses for
about three for defendant,
She, Mrs. Ayers, told me soon after
the first conversation, that she
would rather I was not known
that I was working in the case,
as I would have a better chance to
get evidence from witnesses.

Mrs. Ayers called on me to go
to Danville and with her and have
a ~~consultation~~ ^{consultation} with A. Gardner,
Gardner was at that time in jail,
I went with her and held a
long consultation with her and
Gardner in the jail, at which time
I advised her and Gardner, talked
over the evidence, made a memorandum
of Gardner's statement of the case.
At that meeting we again talked
about my employment and the
fee was again talked over

She told me she would give me two hundred (200) dollars, and if she could not pay it soon she would execute her note for two hundred and fifty dollars.

I continued to work on the case for some Mrs. Watts and her son Wesley as witnesses for defendant Brown. In August I ~~to see parties~~ a village seven or eight miles from Brownsburg, to see parties, to procure evidence, but did not succeed in finding the parties I went to see. I made a memorandum of all the evidence for the defense and that of the State. She often came to my house and office and consulted with me in regard to Gardner's case. I called on her for \$5 my fee a short time before Gardner's trial. She again told me she would pay me soon and if she could not she would execute her note for two hundred and fifty dollars. I worked on the case

until Gardner was acquitted, and did everything that I was employed to do.

The evening after Gardner's trial and acquittal, she came from Keaville stopped at my house for supper, and again she told me she would pay

my fee soon, That she was well pleased
with my services, that I should have
for my services two hundred dollars
and if she were not able to pay it in
a short time, she would execute
her note for two hundred and
fifty dollars. Those statements were
made in the presence of Agnes
Osborn and Gardner Ayers.
She died in a short time and never
paid me any of my fee, nor executed
her note for the same. The sum of
two hundred dollars with interest
is due and unpaid. She owed me
no other money at the time of her
death. Nor did she owe me any on
any other account.

I boarded ~~the~~ ^{Mrs. Ayers'} daughter, Bernice,
seven weeks, for which she agreed to
pay me two dollars and fifty
cents per week. Her daughter was
going to school from my house.
The amount is due and unpaid.

I knew Mr. Campbell and Burr
were employed in the case, but did not
tell either of them that I was employed.
I was the Guardian of Gardner Ayers

Also John T. Burns, ^{defendant, and} administrator
of the estate of Mary Ayres, deceased,
was called by the court, who first
being duly sworn testified as
follows;

I am acquainted with J. H. Johnson, the
plaintiff, knew Mary Ayres in her
lifetime, Am the administrator of
her estate, I am acquainted with her
son Gardner, I was employed by
Mrs. Ayres ~~at~~ in connection with
L. M. Campbell, to defend Gardner
Ayres on an indictment returned
by the grand jury for the murder
of his father ~~in~~ William Ayres, in
July 1875, I did assist in Gardner's
defense, Mr. Campbell conducted the
defense on the trial, and I hunted
up the evidence, That was the part
of the defense that was allotted to
me, I had no knowledge ^{at any time} ~~during the~~
~~trial~~ that Mr. Johnson ^{employed or} was ^{con-}
nected with the defense, I know of
nothing that he did that was of any
advantage to the defendant, and once
complained to him for not taking an interest in the defense as he
was guardian of the defendant
And this was all the evidence given
in the case.

And therefore the Court rendered
his decision, that the plaintiff
recover of the defendant the sum
of seven hundred dollars and fifty cents,
and his costs in this action,

Whereupon the plaintiff moved
the Court for a new trial for causes
set forth in a writing filed at the
time said motion was made.

But the Court overruled said motion
for a new trial, and rendered
judgment for the plaintiff, as appears
in the report, to which the plaintiff
at the time excepted, and prayed an
appeal to the Supreme Court, which
was granted, and forty days' time
was given to the plaintiff to prepare
and file a bill of exceptions.

And said plaintiff now has
tendered this his bill of exceptions,
and prays that the same may be
signed, sealed, and made a part of
the report, which is done this the
27th day of February 1880.
