McClain of the County of Hendricks and State of Indiana are held and firmly bound unto the said State of Indiana in the penal sum of Six Hundred Dollars lawful money of the United States for the payment of which well and truly to be made and done we bind our selves, our heirs executors and administrators Jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 11th day of May A.D 1838

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Richard Askeen will truly and faithfully discharge the duties and perform the trusts committed to him as guardian of the person and estate of Sarah Askeen during the minority of the said Sarah Askeen and render to this Court a just and true account of his said Guardianship when he shall be required, then the above obligation is to be void and of none effect, otherwise to be of full force and remain in full force and virtue in law.

Yours Petitioners Philip McClemin
and Thomas D. McClemin would represent
to your honor that on the 11th day of May
1838 your petitioners together with one Frederick
Atkins entered into a final Bond in the sum
of six hundred Dollars payable to the
State of Indiana Constitution that the said
Frederick Atkins should faithfully
perform the duties and trusts committed
to him as Governor of the prison and
Estate of Sarah Atkins a sumand
and that letters of guardianship was
accordingly issued to said Atkins as
quarantine affirmed your petitioners as such
trustees are approposum that the said
Frederick Atkins is wasting said Estate
and neglecting his duty as such Governor
whereby your petitioners as the security of
the said Frederick Atkins may be liable
to suffer a serious loss your petitioners
therefore pray your honor to grant
to them relief according to the sum of
the costs in this Case specially
made and incurred

The undersigned guardian of the person and estate
of Sarah Ashken, daughter of William Ashken, deceased,
begs leave to report, that since his appointment to said trust,
to wit, on the 28th day of May 1838, he received from the
Executor of the last will and testament of John Ashken, late
of Washington County, State of Kentucky, ^{deceased,} the sum of one hundred
and thirteen dollars and forty four cents \$113. 44

Interest thereon from the date of reception until the
18th day of ~~September~~ 1839, five dollars ~~forty five~~ ^{six} cents 5.45

which is a full report of all sums that have come into his hands \$118.89

He charges for twenty days in going to Kentucky
in Washington County, to collect the above money
at seventy five cents per day for self and horse \$15.00

To expenses in travelling nineteen dollars 19.00

Which left a balance in his hands of \$84.89

He reserves five dollars for expenses in Probate court. \$5.00

\$79.89

And for the above & last mentioned sum of seventy nine
dollars and ^{eighty nine} ~~one~~ cents, he herewith presents said Sarah's
Receipt, who is twenty one years of age the 19th March, 1839.
And he prays to be discharged from said guardianship.
