The petition of Sarah Askren daughter of William
Askren late of the County of Washington and State of
Kentucky deceased, respectfully sheweth, that your
petitioner is a minor above the age of fourteen years
and has no guardian appointed to take care of her
person and estate. She therefore prays your Honor
to permit her to choose a guardian for the purposes
aforesaid. And your petitioner will ever pray &c

Your Petitioners Philip McClain
and Thomas D. McClain would represent
to your honor that on the 14th day of May
1838 your petitioners together with one Burkhard
Ashkins entered into a joint Bond in the sum
of one hundred Dollars payable to the
State of Indiana Conditioned that the said
Burkhard Ashkins should faithfully
perform the duties and trusts committed
to him as Guardian of the person and
Estate of Sarah Ashkins a minor
and that letters of Guardianship was
accordingly issued to Sarah Ashkins as
guardian of her person and your petitioners as such
sureties are apprehensive that the said
Burkhard Ashkins is wasting said Estate
and neglecting his duty as such Guardian
Whereby your petitioners as the security of
the said Burkhard Ashkins may be liable
to suffer a serious loss your petitioners
therefore pray your honor to grant
to them relief according to the form of
the statute in this Case specially
made and provided
November 11th 1839





Know all men by these presents that we Richard Askren, Phillip McBlain Thomas D. McBlain of the County of Hendricks and State of Indiana are held and firmly bound unto the said State of Indiana in the penal sum of Six Hundred Dollars lawful money of the United States for the payment of which well and truly to be made and done we bind our selves, our heirs executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 15th day of May A D 1838

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Richard Askren will truly and faithfully discharge the duties and perform the trusts committed to him as guardian of the person and estate of Sarah Askren during the minority of the said Sarah Askren and render to this Court a just and true account of his said Guardianship when he shall be thereunto required, then the above obligation is to be void and of none effect, otherwise to be of ~~none effect~~ and remain in full force and virtue in law
