To the Sheriff of *Hendricks* County--Greeting:You are hereby commanded to cite *Calvin Ballard administrator*

of the estate of *Uriah P. Baber* late of said county of *Hendricks*, deceased, if *he* may be found in your bailiwick to be and appear before the Court of Common Pleas of said county, on *Tuesday* the *second* day of the next term of said Court, to be begun and held at the Court House in *Danville*, on the *4th* Monday in *July 1854*, then and there to render to said Court *an* account of *his* administration, under oath; Showing, First, clearly and succinctly, the entire aggregate amount of such estate, which came to *his* hands to be administered; Secondly, the amount paid out by *him* on account of such trust, to whom and for what paid, and the aggregate amount of such payments, and produce and file receipts for each of such payments; Thirdly, that *he* show clearly the aggregate amount of such estate still remaining unappropriated: and, Fourthly, that *he* make final settlement of said estate, or show the legal cause why such settlement cannot be made. And of this *he* may not fail at *his* peril: And have you then there this writ.
