Be it Remembered,

That on the 31st day of January 1883
the same being the 26th Juridical day
of the January Term 1882 of the
Hendricks Circuit Court before
the Honorable Joshua G. Tolman
the Judge of said Court, the
following Judgment and decree
was rendered, to wit,

In the matter of the heirship
of Emma Ballard, George
J Jones, Lilly Jones, Samuel
Jones, Charles Jones & Oliver
P Morris heirs of Eleanor
Jones deceased.

Comes now
Emma Ballard & Colvin Ballard her
husband George J Jones, and George
J Jones guardian of Lilly Jones
Samuel Jones, Charles Jones and
Oliver P Morris minor heirs of
Eleanor Jones deceased and before
fully represent and show to the
Court that on the day of
187 Eleanor Jones the Grand mother
of your petitioner died in Hen-
dricks County Indiana, and
that afterwards James W. Emma
was duly appointed and qualified

As Administrator of said Decedent's
Estate, And that on the 17th day of June
1878 the said Administrator made
his final report to this Court, show-
ing that there was then in his hands
the sum of \$477⁶⁵ for distribution
among the heirs of said Decedent,
which sum was by him upon the
order of the Court paid over to the
Clerk of this Court for distribution.
And that upon the ~~proofs~~ adduced
it was ordered and decreed by
this ~~Court~~ Court that the said sum
of \$477⁶⁵ should be distributed
as follows.

Mary A. Givens 1/5 part or \$123.35
Allen A. Stephens (be it noted he left no wife) 48.50
Emma Ballard 1/5 part or 123.35
George J. Jones, Lillie Jones, Samuel
Jones, and Charles Jones 1/5 part or 123.35
William Morris, David H. Morris
Mary K. Morris & Oliver P. Morris 1/5 part or 123.35
And that all of the above sum of \$
had been paid over to said heirs
except the sum of \$277⁸⁵ which
belongs to the above named Emma
Ballard, George J. Jones, Lillie Jones,
Samuel Jones, Charles Jones and
Oliver P. Morris, in proportion as
above set forth.

And that on the 17th day of
August 1881 the Clerk of this Court

paid unto sum of \$ 277²⁵ belonging
to your petitioner, D. P. Baldwin
Atty. Genl. for the State of Indiana
for being his receipt therefor. And that
the same was paid by said Atty. Genl.
into the office of Treasurer of State
pursuant to the Statute in such cases
provided. And that the said Emma
Baldwin is now of age, and married to
one Colvin Ballard a man of full
age who also joins in this Petition.
And that said George J. Jones is
now of age and that he is now
the duly appointed and acting guard
in for the above named, Lucy Jones,
Samuel Jones, Charles Jones, and
Oliver P. Morris. Wherefore they pray
the Court that upon dates satisfactory
they may be adjudged to be the legal
heirs of Mrs. Eleanor Jones deceased,
and the individual persons mentioned
in the final report. After which Adminis-
tration. And that said Treasurer
of State be ordered and authorized
to pay the above sum of \$ 277²⁵, to
Thaddeus Adams Alling in such for
your petitioner.

set forth in the foregoing petition are
true in substance and in fact,

Charles Jones & Oliver P Morris
who have by power of Attorney author-
ized Shad Stedman as their attorney in
fact to collect, receive and receipt
for the money in the State Treasury belong-
ing to them as aforesaid, are the
identical persons referred to in
the report of Miss Adelicia Hall, and
that they are lawfully entitled to all
of said sum of \$277²⁴ received
of the Attorney General from the
Ork of the Freedoms Circuit Court
and by him paid into the State Treasury
all of which is finally ordered
adjudged and decided by the
Court.
