the Probate <sup>Court</sup> of Hendricks County. now in session  
at the August Term thereof - 1836, The Petition  
of Joseph A. Baugh son of William A. Baugh  
and Jane H. Baugh Daughters of William A. Baugh  
Respectfully sheweth that your petitioners and  
both minors above the age of fourteen years  
and have no guardian in this State to take  
care of their estates and an estate having  
devolved to them (and two other infant heirs, John  
A. Baugh and William C. Baugh both under  
fourteen years of age, sons of William A.  
Baugh from ~~the~~ John Thucard deceased  
late of the State of Ohio viz two hundred dollars  
They therefore <sup>pray</sup> your Honor to permit them  
to choose a guardian for the purposes aforesaid.

and firmly bound unto said State Indiana in the penal  
sum of Four hundred Dollars \_\_\_\_\_ lawfully money  
of the United States for the payment of which well added  
truly to be made and done we bind ourselves our heirs Executors  
and Administrators Jointly and severally firmly by  
these presents sealed with our seals and dated this the 10<sup>th</sup>  
day of August A.D. 1836

The condition of the above obligation is  
such that if the above bound William A. Baugh \_\_\_\_\_ will truly  
and faithfully, discharge the duties and perform the trusts  
committed to him <sup>as</sup> guardian of the property of Joseph A. Baugh, Jane  
H. Baugh, John H. Baugh and William C. Baugh (his own children) and Heirs to the Estate  
of John Hincaid their Grandfather <sup>late of Missouri</sup> during the minority  
of the said Joseph A., Jane H., John H. and William C. Baugh  
and render to this Court a just and true account of  
his said Guardianship when he shall be thereunto required  
then the above obligation is to be void and of none effect otherwise  
to be and remain in full force and virtue in Law.
