In the *Hendricks* Circuit Court, *March* Term, Eighteen Hundred
and Forty *seven*

THE GRAND JURORS for the State of Indiana, empanelled, sworn, and charged to inquire
within and for the body of the County of *Hendricks* aforesaid, upon their oath
present, that *James Cure* late of said County,

together with *Jacob Sharp* *Seth Guinn* *Noah Titmaster*
John Silyman *William Guinn* *Robert Jones*
Benjamin Snodgrass and *Richard Arnold*

all late of the same place, on the *first* day of *October* in the year Eighteen
Hundred and Forty *Six* with force and arms in said County, did then and there unlawfully,
riotously, routously, and tumultuously, actually do an unlawful act of violence, to-wit: did there and
then unlawfully, riotously, routously, and tumultuously *tear down the chimney of*

and more a certain house then and there
being on the land of one Elizabeth Walker there
situate

contrary to the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dig-
nity of the State of Indiana.
