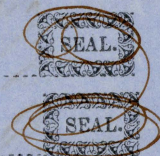

THE CONDITION OF THE ABOVE OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That if the above bounden

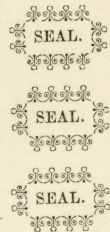
