of Joseph A. Craig, deceased, to be and appear before the Hon-
ourable the Judge of the Mendricks Probate Court, on the first
day of his next term, to be holden at the Court House in the
town of Danville on the Second Monday in May next, and
then and there shew Cause, if any, he has, why the estate
aforesaid shall not be finally settled up and closed. And
have you then these writs.

successor upon reasonable demand made thereof, then the above obligation is to be void and of none effect,



