Said Administrator shows to the Court that when letters of administration were taken, he thought and had good reason to believe that said estate was solvent, and that the assets left by said decedent would pay all of decedent's debts, but he after wards discovered that said estate was insolvent, and that he has given notice, under the orders of the Court to settle said estate as an insolvent estate.

That after paying all of the preferred claims and expenses of administration there was left the sum of \$18.78 to be distributed among the general creditors, which sum should be pro-rated among said creditors according to the amount of their several claims. A list of which is herewith set out.

He says that item No. 3, on the inventory was placed there through mistake, the hog mentioned in said item, half of the same only, belonging to said estate. And he was compelled to pay Mary A. Emsinger \$2.50, which is item No. 9, on this report, for her half of said hog, he having sold the same at Public Sale.

And that there were a great number of claims to adjust and settle. And the stock belonging to said estate he was compelled to look after, care for and feed, and he thinks that he ought to be and is entitled to \$50.00, for his services in behalf of said trust. And he asks the Court to allow him said sum.

He asks the Court to approve this report, and discharge himself and bondsmen from any further liability on that account.
