## A will

I Amos Darnall of Hendricks County and State of Indiana do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

First I direct that my body <sup>be</sup> decently interred, and that my funeral be conducted in a manner corresponding with my Estate and situation in life; and as to such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to intrust ~~with~~ ~~me~~ <sup>me</sup> with I dispose of the same in the following manner, to wit; I direct first that there be a sale as soon after my decease as possible of my ~~present~~ <sup>present</sup> crop and of all my personal Estate that can be best spared off of the farm & that the products be applied to paying my Just debts and funeral Expenses and should there be an overplus I direct that the same be applied to the use of my family, and should there not be enough of my <sup>crop</sup> ~~present~~ <sup>present</sup> ~~crop~~ as Above named to pay my debts after procuring one years provision for my family, I ~~further~~ direct that my farm be applied next season in the manner my Executors think best so as to procure money to pay the Balance of my debts, I also direct that the whole of my household furniture remain the absolute property of my beloved wife if she shall be living at the time of my decease but if she shall not survive me then that <sup>the</sup> same be sold and the products applied to the raising of my children, and further direct that my beloved wife remain in possession of my farm that I now live on during life or so long as she remains my widow for the raising of my little children and in case I shall leave any child or children living at the time of my decease I hereby direct (by the assistance of my Executors) ~~my dear~~ <sup>my dear</sup> wife shall have the Guardianship and tuition of them during their minority so long as she shall continue sole and



unmarried and in case of her marriage or death I direct that my Executors ~~take~~ take charge of the same and as I hold a certain tract of land not attached to this farm to wit Eighty acres lying east of this farm which now stands mortgaged in the School Commissioners office for a certain sum of money not due at present. and now provided my two oldest sons to wit William and Franklin should by there good economy and industry support the family and the profits of this farm and there should be an overplus the same to be applied by my Executors to the payment of the above debt & should they be successful in ~~making~~ lifting the above mortgage I hereby bequeath the above named Eighty acres of land to the said William & Franklin to be divided share & share a like, <sup>between them</sup> & should they not be successful in lifting the above named mortgage I direct that my Executors dispose of said tract of land in the way they think best to procure the payment of the above mortgage & apply the overplus if any to be divided into equal shares & paid to my children as they come of age or marry, and I further direct that at the death of my wife if my children are all of age, that my farm that I now live on be sold and that the products thereof be Equally divided between my children that are then living after paying to my youngest son James Harrison one hundred dollars over & above what the balance Receives, and I hereby make and ordain my worthy and esteemed friends Amos & Mills and Louis pounds Executors of this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I Amos Larnald the testator have hereunto set my hand and seal this the ~~thirty~~ twenty ninth day of November in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty Six



