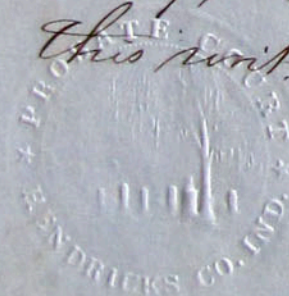

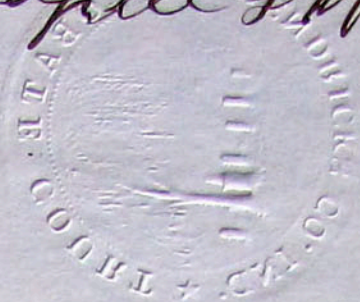

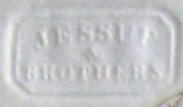

The undersigned would state to your
Honor that Amos Dillon late of the County of
Hendricks and State of Indiana, departed
this life intestate, leaving the following named
Children who are minors within the age
of twenty one year, and who have an
interest the estate of their said father
which requires the attention of a guardian
to wit, Abia Dillon aged Eighteen (18)
years old the 17th day of September 1849
Judith Ann Dillon aged fifteen (15) years
old the 17th of October 1849. And John Dillon
aged thirteen (13) years the 9th of October 1849.

that since the death of the said Amos,
his widow has married and left the
premises of her former husband, in the
possession of said infants, so that
