Rebecca Fleshman, widow of George
Fleshman, late of the County of Macon
in the State of Illinois, dec'd. would state
that since the death of her husband, she,
together with her children, have returned
to the home of her father, John Alexander,
in the County of Hendricks, in the State
of Indiana. That her children by the
said George Fleshman are three in
number, and of the age following,
respectively,

John George Fleshman was born
October the 4th 1845.

William Scott Fleshman was
born October 12th 1848. And

Mary Margaret Christiana Fleshman
was born March 1st 1857.

That they are heirs of the estate of their
father, situated & being in Macon County, Illinois
amounting to the sum of five or six hundred
dollars, personally, and a farm, containing
One hundred & six acres; of which sixty or
seventy acres is in cultivation. That her
said children have no guardians to take
charge of their interest. She therefore
asks, that her said father, John Alexander
maybe appointed guardian of the two last
named children, who are under ~~Twenty~~¹⁴ years
of age. And that her said son John George, may
be permitted to choose a guardian, — he
being over 14 years of age.

John Alexander being selected as the guardian of the persons and estates of his grand children, John George Fleckman, William Scott Fleckman and Mary Margaret Christiana Fleckman, makes the following statement of their property so far as the same has come to his knowledge.

He is informed & believes it true, that they have about five or six hundred dollars in the hands of the Administrator of their father, of the personally: and that they are the owners of a tract of land, containing One hundred and six acres, supposed to be of the value of three thousand dollars. All of which is in the County of Macou in the State of Illinois. And which is all the estate to which they are entitled, so far as he has knowledge.

The real estate is of about the rental value of One hundred and sixty dollars per annum.
