


Now All Men by these presents that  
we Augustine Pierson and William Pierson of  
the County of Hendricks, and State of Indiana  
are held and firmly bound unto the State of  
Indiana in the sum of four hundred dollars  
lawful Money of the United States, for the  
payment whereof well and truly to be made  
and done we bind ourselves, our heirs &c.  
Jointly & severally, firmly by these presents.  
Sealed with our seals, and dated this 11<sup>th</sup>  
day of November 1842.

The Condition of the above obligation is  
such that if the above bound Augustine Pierson  
will truly and faithfully discharge the duties  
and perform the trusts committed to, and re-  
quired of him as guardian of the person &  
estate of James Ford during the minority  
of the said James, and will render unto  
the Hendricks probate Court a Just & true  
account of his said guardianship  
when he shall be thereto requested, then  
the above obligation is to be null & void  
otherwise to be and remain in full  
force and virtue in law

To the Honorable Judge Stand at the  
November Term 1846.

Augustine Pierson  
Guardian of the Estate of James Ford  
Would report that some time in the month  
of October 1843 he received of James Ford  
Senior of Shelby County Kentucky the sum  
of Two hundred dollars; that being the whole  
and entire Amount to which his said  
ward was entitled; that immediately upon  
receiving the same he paid off a debt due from  
his said ward of fifty dollars, to Seth Cook  
of Kentucky, and upon his return he  
paid over to said ward One hundred  
and fifty dollars, and took his (said ward)  
receipt therefor; But neglected to take any  
receipt for the fifty dollars paid to Cook;  
that he has paid all fees occasioned by  
his said guardianship; but cannot settle  
at this time for the want of a receipt for the  
<sup>money paid</sup> said Cook. Nothing whatever remains in  
his hands belonging to said ward nor is  
there any money or property whatever coming  
to him. Said ward has long since arrived  
at the age of twenty one years, but resides  
so far off as to render it necessary to ask  
a continuance of this case to enable him  
to get a receipt for said fifty dollars, which  
he will try and get by the next Term
