died two days holding for Robert C. Goffett in
his lifetime, but does not recollect whether

Elizabeth Hollinsworth who after being duly sworn upon her oath
stated that she was present one night at the house
of the Plaintiff and saw Plaintiff pay to Robert
C. Goffett deceased in his lifetime fifty and
dollars, in money, does not recollect what
conversation took place between Plaintiff
and deceased but understood that the
money was to be paid to Benjamin by
deceased, witness further says, that the Plaintiff
was indebted to the said Robert C. Goffett
at the time of his death some one hundred
dollars,

David Vestal a witness who after
being duly sworn upon his oath says that
previously to the death of Robert C. Goffett
witness was present and Plaintiff and
deceased made a trade, deceased sold
to Plaintiff cotton Mills for about twelve
hundred dollars, and witness wrote
the notes which were given to deceased
by Plaintiff for the Mills some three
or four notes and saw Plaintiff
execute them, and deliver them to
deceased, Witness further says that a
short time after the death of Robert
C. Goffett thinks in 1836, Plaintiff
called upon witness for advice and
then told witness that he, Plaintiff, had
in the lifetime of Robert C. Goffett paid
him twenty dollars in money that
he had not received a credit for upon

either of the notes by ~~Plff~~ given to him
in his lifetime and Plaintiff wished
to have ~~it~~ ^{now} he could get said
credit of twenty ~~five~~ dollars
advanced into him Plaintiff
said nothing ^{about} his having said
other amounts of money which
had not been credited into
him upon said notes by the deceased
and the above being all the evidence
introduced by the Plaintiff in this
case the Defendant offering
no evidence whatever, To the introduc-
-tion and admissibility of which testimony
the defendant objected as being
wholly illegal and contrary to law
but the Court overruled said

At this time come the parties by their counsel &
the court being sufficiently advise^d of the premises give
the following opinion and judgment pronounced by Judge
Sullivan

Assumpsit by Hollingsworth against the plain-
tiffs in error in the Hendricks Probate Court.
Plea, non assumpsit. The cause by consent of parties
was tried by the Court & judgment was given for the
plaintiff. During the trial, objections were made by the
defendants below to the competency of a part of the
testimony, & to the sufficiency of the residue all of which
were overruled by the Court, & the defendants excepted.

The action was founded on an account for money
paid, & work done and performed for the intestate in
his lifetime. It was proven that the plaintiff in the Court
below, paid to the intestate R. Gossett a short time before

his death, a sum of money which Gossett agreed to credit on a note he held on Hollingsworth. The payment was not endorsed on the note at the time it was made but there ~~was~~ no proof that it had not been subsequently credited, nor was there any proof that the amount had been again demanded of Hollingsworth. The object of the present suit was in part to recover back the money so paid.

On this testimony the court should not have given judgment for the plaintiff. The intestate received the money in part payment of a debt justly due to him, & whether he endorsed the amount so paid on the note or not, it was a payment of which the plaintiff can at the proper time avail himself.

A witness notwithstanding the defendants objected to the testimony, was permitted to prove that Hollingsworth (the plaintiff in the Probate Court) told him that he had paid to Dr. Gossett in his lifetime twenty dollars for which he had not received a credit on his note. This was so manifestly wrong, that if there were no other error in the record, it would be sufficient of itself to reverse the judgment.

On the count for work and labor there was no testimony. The witness swore that he (the witness) performed certain labor for the intestate, but there was no testimony to show that

Hollingsworth had a right to sue for the labor so performed.

It is therefore considered by the court that the judgment of Probate Court be reversed and all the proceedings subsequent to the issue be set aside at the costs of the defendant in error, & that this Cause be remanded to said for another trial herein, all which is ordered to be certified to said Court.

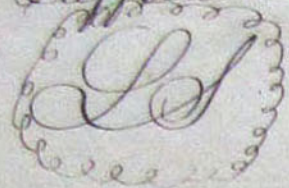

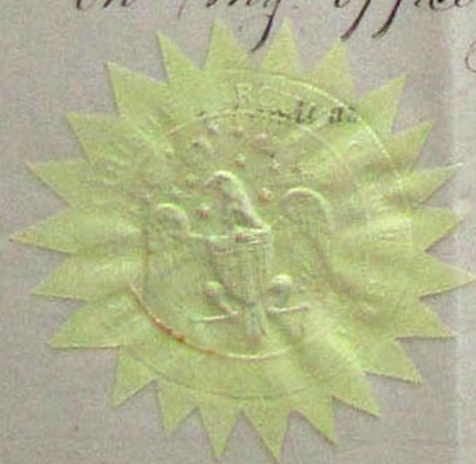
