Know all men by these presents, that I Henry E Green of County of Monmouth and State of Indiana am held and firmly bound to Thomas Linn, in the Penal sum of One thousand Dollars Lawful money for the payment of which well and truly, I bind myself, my heirs executor and administrators jointly & severally this Sixteenth day of August 1856.

The Conditions of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bounden Henry E Green has this day sold unto the Thomas Linn the Property now occupied by James Torbert, dwelling house & Black Smith Shop with the Lots and all the appertinances therunto belonging in Morton Green addition to the Town of Brownstown, as deed to me by said James Torbert

Now if the said Henry E Green shall make or cause to be made unto the said Thomas Linn a good and Lawful deed in fee simple for said House & Lots So soon as the purchase money with the Taxes accruing each Year from and after 1856, as set forth in five promissory notes, as, One hundred & fifty Dollars due 25th December 1856, Two hundred Dollars due first day November 1857, Two hundred Dollars due on the first day November 1858 Two hundred Dollars due on the first day November 1859 and Two hundred Dollars due the first day November 1860, Then the foregoing obligation shall be null and void otherwise to remain in full force in Law.
