of the County of Hendricks and State of Indiana, do make and publish this My last Will and Testament, thereby revoking and making null and void all former wills by me heretofore at any time made.

First I will my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the earth, to be decently interred in a manner corresponding with my estate and situation in life.

Secondly, I will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid immediately after my death,

Thirdly, I give unto my wife, <sup>Martha</sup> (Should she survive me) or so long as she remains my widow, during her natural life, the possession and benefit of the farm and dwelling where I now live, consisting of the following pieces of Land to wit, The East half of the South East quarter of section One in Township fifteen North, of Range One West containing Eighty Acres, Also the North West and South West fractional quarters of Section six in Township fifteen North, of range one East, the two together containing twenty two Acres and fifty eight hundredths of an Acre, And also thirty Acres off of the South half of the North East quarter of the section last aforesaid, bounded as follows to wit, beginning at the South West corner of said quarter section, thence North Eighty rod, to a stake, Thence East Sixty rod, to a stake, thence South Eighty rod to a stake, Thence West Sixty rod to the place of beginning, It being the piece of land deeded to me by John Darnall, Also it is my will that my sd wife possess & enjoy during her life or widowhood all my personal estate

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my son James V. Hambliton this heirs and assigns forever, all of the above described land with the appurtenances therunto belonging and every part and parcel thereof, (the possession and profits during the natural life of my wife being reserved) which aforesaid lands shall be in full of his right and interest as an heir to my estate

And fifthly It is my will that all the balance of my estate, be equally divided; both real and personal between my sons and daughters, to wit, Matilda Foster,

And lastly, Should my said wife Martha survive  
me, and Mary again, then it is my will that she have  
and receive one third part of all my <sup>present and</sup> personal estate, <sup>not being disposed of</sup> ~~only~~,  
in full of her right of Dower, or any other <sup>right</sup> which she  
might possess as my widow, And that my son James V.  
immediately upon the happening of such a marriage, take  
and have full possession of the lands aforesaid, And that  
the remainder of the two thirds of my personal estate, and  
all the balance of my real estate not herein described, be  
equally divided as aforesaid, between my children above  
named.
