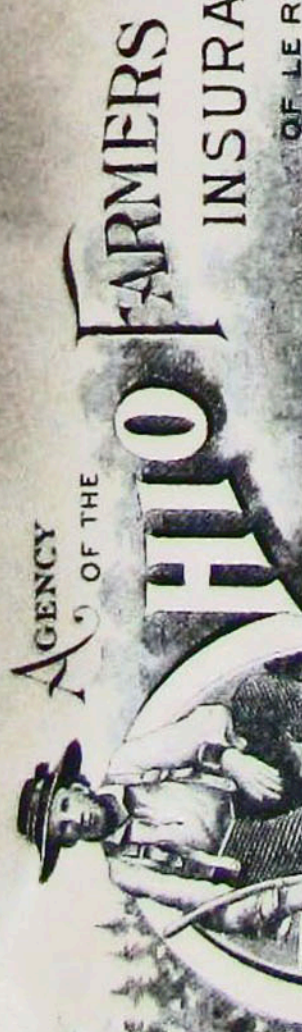

I John Hannak of the County of Hendricks and State of Indiana do make and publish my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made. First I direct that ~~all my just debts~~ <sup>my body</sup> be decently interred, and as to such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with I dispose of the same in manner following, to wit, I direct First that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid and especially that should I not ~~survive~~ my present illness that my executors hereafter named in this my last will and testament use due diligence to collect of monies which are now due to me in due time to pay the last instalments to the school commissioner of Hendricks County for the west half of the the north east quarter and the east half of the northwest quarter and the west half of the south east quarter of Section No. 16 in Township No. 14. North of Range one west being school lands for which I hold a certificate of purchase and payment of the first payment the last mentioned half quarter being by assignment from Robert Crwin and that the last payment on the said lands be be duly made by my said executors as aforesaid and that the deed or conveyance to the same be made to my lawful representatives in <sup>trust</sup> or in such a lawful manner that the same may be disposed according to the directions in this <sup>my last</sup> will and testament herein after given. Secondly for the purpose of raising and educating my children and providing a comfortable support and maintenance for my beloved wife Elizabeth I direct that all my personal property after the payment of all my just debts, and all the rents and profits of my real estate not inconsistent with the directions herein after given, be and remain in possession of my beloved wife Elizabeth during the minority of my children or so long as she shall remain sole and unmarried and I hereby direct and appoint that my said dear wife shall have the guardianship and tuition of all my children during their minority or so long as she shall continue sole and unmarried and for the purpose of raising my ~~children~~ <sup>my several</sup> children comfortably and giving them as liberal an Education as a prudent disposition of my Estate will justify my said wife shall have authority to use and dispose of my said effects in such economical manner as she



shall deem best calculated to subserve the ends aforesaid.

Thirdly I direct that ~~after~~ my Eldest son Patterson shall arrive at lawful age or shall marry that all my real estate shall be divided into four lots or tenements of equal value or as near so as the ~~circumstances~~ of circumstances will permit or into one part for each of my surviving sons and that my several sons namely Patterson Thomas, John & William have a right each to choose and ~~possess~~ and occupy according to seniority one portion <sup>as they shall severally become of age</sup> each and that they shall finally inherit each his several portion. Provided my aforesaid beloved wife shall have a right to a <sup>comfortable</sup> support and maintenance from the rents and profits of the said lands during her natural life.

Fourthly I direct that what may remain of my personal property and what may be realized from the rents of my real estate during the minority of my sons after raising & educating my children as aforesaid be divided amongst my said wife and several daughters giving to each of my daughters namely Maria, Jane, Elizabeth, Nancy Ann, Lucinda and Mary a portion as they severally become of age <sup>lawful</sup> so that they may severally be put upon an equality as near as practicable and that my said wife be allowed to possess her lawful or equal part of the same. And further in any case, <sup>or point</sup> wherein this my last will and testament is inexplicit or ambiguous that the same be settled and disposed of according to law and justice. And I hereby make and ordain my friend and neighbor Harmon Piatt and my beloved wife Elizabeth Executors of this my last will and testament - In witness whereof I John Hannah the testator have hereunto set my hand and seal this twelfth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty
