The claimant, Virginia A. Darnall, complains of the estate of Robert Hervey, deceased, and says:-That on the 4th. day of July 1894 she left her own home and went to the home of the decedent, Robert Hervey, and took care of and nursed Angeline Hervey, wife of the said Robert Hervey, until the death of the said Angeline on the 6th. day of March 1895, a period of thirty five (35) weeks; that during that time she furnished the food for the said Angeline from the house of the claimant, and cooked and prepared it at the home of the claimant and carried the same to the said Angeline; that she nursed the said Angeline day and night, administered to her her medicines, washed her body, changed her clothing, and cared for her by day and sat up with her at night; that most of the time between the dates mentioned the said Angeline was confined to her bed and totally unable to help herself, or care for her household; that her said husband, Robert Hervey, failed and refused to hire a woman or any person to care for his household or to nurse his wife, or to cook her food or wash her or administer her medicines, or sit up with her at night, and that he neglected to care for the said Angeline or procure any one to care for her; that if the claimant in this case had not cared for the said Angeline in manner and for as above set out the said Angeline would have suffered; that during the time above mentioned the claimant kept and swept, and kept clean the house of the decedent, Robert Hervey, made his beds and cooked his meals, and looked after his household, and that all



of the services rendered to the said Hervey and his said wife, Angeline, and in and about said household, during the time above mentioned, were rendered with the full knowledge, consent and acquiescence of the said Robert Hervey. She says that her services were reasonably worth the sum of Four hundred and forty dollars, (\$440.00), and she states her account as follows:-

17 weeks, from July 4th. 1894 to Oct. 31st. 1894 at \$10. per week--\$170.00

18 weeks from Nov. 1st. 1894 to Mch. 6th. 1895 at \$15. per week--- 270.00

Questioned by George C. Harvey, Atty.

Q. 1. State your name?

A. 1. William M. Robinson.

Q. 2. State where you live?

A. 2. North Salem, Hendricks County, State of Indiana.

Q. 3. How long have you lived there?

A. 3. 5 years.

Q. 4. Where did you live before you went to North Salem to live?

A. 4. About 3 or 4 years before that I lived in Putnam County.

Q. 5. What part of Putnam County?

A. 5. In Floyd township. Was born and raised in Floyd township and Marion.

Q. 6. Are you married or single?

A. 6. I am married at this time. Have been married about <sup>or 14</sup> 15 years.

Q. 7. How many children?

A. 7. Have 3 children.

Q. 8. What are their ages?

A. 8. The oldest will soon be 13 years old, the other one is 9 years and the youngest is going on 6.

Q. 9. What is your business?

A. 9. Attorney at law and general collecting agent.

Q. 10. How long have you been practicing law.

A. 10. Going on 5 years.

Q. 11. What counties do you practice in?

A. 11. In Hendricks Circuit Court, Putnam Circuit Court, and in Montgomery Circuit Court and before the Justice Court



of Putnam and Hendricks Counties.

Q. 12. Have you ever had any business in the Supreme Court?

A. 12. No sir.

Q. 13. How long have you known Robert Hervey?

A. 13. I have known him ever since I was 3 or 4 years old.

Q. 14. Where did you know him?

A. 14. He used to live at my father's house in Putnam County when I was little. He bought me my first suit of clothes, first pair of red top boots and first suspenders.

*Sometime in May* you say  
Q. 15. On the 1st. day of May, 1896, you loaned Robert Hervey \$260.00, due in 30 days?

A. 15. Yes sir. I think it was on or about that date.

Q. 20. Is that as near as you can fix the date?

A. Yes sir. I fix the date by case that was in court at that time.

Q. 21. What case was that?

A. It was the case of John Nevilles. I think it came up on the second day *Wednesday of the term I am not sure*

Q. 22. If you remember it was Monday, the day the case was disposed of?

A. The day the case was continued.

Q. 24. The day the case of the State of Indiana vs. John Nevilles was continued?

Yes sir.

Q. 25. Are you positive?

A. I think I am. *not Positive that was the day*

Q. 26. Since that time you have looked up that Record?

A. I did. I wanted to see what day the 2 Wednesday would be on and it was that day.



Q. 27. You know that was the day the case was continued?

A. I think it was to the best of my recollection.

Q. 28. When did you first see Mr. Harvey that day?

A. I was at the court house.

Q. 29. Did you have a talk with him?

A. Yes sir. He called me to him. I was sitting in the witness chair, when he motioned me to come over to him. I went over to him. He told me he had just come back from Ohio, and asked me if I had any money. He did not say so, but I just thought he wanted it to send back to Ohio. I said I had some money, and he said he would like to borrow a little. I asked him how much. And he said he would like about \$250.00, and I said I did not want to let it out, as I wanted to finish paying for my home. He reminded me that he had had \$100.00, a short time before and had paid it back promptly. Said he had accommodated me a number of times and he thought I ought to let him have *it*.

Q. 30. Did you let him have the money?

A. I did.

Q. 31. Where?

A. About 12 o'clock John Nevilles and I was coming out of the Court house talking, when I saw him come round the corner of the court house and <sup>he</sup> stopped me.

Q. 31. What did you do?

A. He said are you going to let me have that money? That \$250.00, and I said I would rather not let him have it.

Q. 32. What else?

He insisted that I accommodate him. Said he had accommodated me a number of times, and he thought I ought to him.



Q. 33. Was John Nevilles with you at that time?

A. He was right there.

Q. 34. Did John say anything?

A. No nothing at that time.

Q. 35. Did you introduce him to Mr. Hervey?

A. No sir. I think he knew him. When I first got to thinking over the matter it seemed to me that while I was standing there talking to him that Bill Nichols came along and saw me counting the money out to him, but since then I talked to Bill and I think I must have been mistaken.

Q. 36. You mean Windy Nichols?

A. Yes.

Q. 37. Were you and Bob talking when Windy came up?

Yes sir and he came along.

Q. 38. You knew Bob Hervey very well, intimately?

A. Yessir I did. I knew him very well.

Q. 39. You frequently had conversations with him did you not?

A. Yes sir. Always. Always come to me and talked.

Q. 40. Were you a frequent visitor at his house?

A. Yes sir. I often visited him. Had not been there since his wife died. *but once*

Q. 41. Now did you let him have the money?

A. Yes sir.

Q. 41. Where were when you gave it to him?

A. I gave the money while we were standing there between the door and gate. I just had \$200.00, and I said if you only want it for 30 days you had better take it all. He



said he did not need so much but would take it. He stood there and counted it. I said we had better go over to Crabbe and Parker's bank and get a note. He stepped out a little to look at the clock and said it was so near dinner time, said something about giving an iron clad note, I did not pay much attention to that, but said it was so near dinner time he would go home make out a note and hand it to me right after dinner. Said he would bring it to me right after dinner. I went home and never saw the note or him anymore.

Q. 42. Where did you go for dinner?

A. Over to some one of these restaurants.

Q. 43. Well did you see Bob anymore that afternoon?

A. No sir.

Q. 44. Did you go down to the house?

A. No sir.

Q. 45. Did you hunt for him at all?

A. I didn't. When I went home I did. I wrote him.

Q. 46. Did you write him a letter?

A. Yes sir.

Q. 47. What time did you leave town?

A. Left town about 12.30 or between 12.30 and 1 o'clock.

Something came <sup>up</sup> some little matter, and we went home right away, when I got home I wrote him.

A. It was money that I had made and saved during the past two years.

Q. 59. Did you carry this \$200.00 in your pocket all the time?

A. Yes, Only except when he had the \$100.00, I had it all the time.

Q. 60. What kind of a pocket book did you have?

A. I had a big pocket-book, but did not carry it in that. I had it rapped up in a piece of paper.

Q. 61. Have any money in the bank?

A. Just what money I lived on. *Near \$300*

Q. 62. Did you carry this money in your pocket all the time?

A. Yes sir. Except when buying and selling notes.

Q. 63. Have you ever bought <sup>and sold</sup> any notes?

A. Yes sir. For other men. I have sold them on commission.

Q. 64. What notes have <sup>you</sup> ever sold.

A. Lots of them. I did not buy them, but have sold them. Men would bring me notes and say here sell these for so much or bring me so much money, and all over that you can have.

A. He would just say take this, bring me so much money and all over that you can have.

Q. 66. Ever sell any notes for yourself. Your own note?

A. No. I have one now if you will give me \$.15 for it you can have it.

Q. 67. Did you ever have any money loaned out and take note?

A. Yes once.

Q. 68. When was that?

A. Once 3 or 4 years ago. I think on the 3rd. of Nov. 3 years ago.

Q. 69. Is that all the money you have loaned out?

A. Yes sir.



Q. 70. All you ever had?

A. Yes all lately.

Q. 71. Now how long had you had this money? This \$280.00?

A. I had not had all of it all the time. It was the savings of two years. What I had not put in property and what I had not lived on.

Q. 72. And you kept that money in your pocket all the time? All the time it was accumulating?

A. Yes sir. Except the \$100.00, I let him have before for 30 days.

Q. 73. You were saving this money to pay for your property?

A. Yes sir.

Q. 80. Did it give you the privilege to pay as much or as little as you wanted to.

A. Yes sir. So that I paid the \$7.00, per month.



Was it

Q. 81. Drawing interest?

A. Yes sir. Interest all counted in in first place with the principal.

Q. 82. I believe the only bank you had money in was the NorthSalem bank?

A. Yes sir. I think since last October a year ago I have had deposited about \$3.00.00 *300 Hundred dollars*

Q. 83. Your own money?

A. Yes sir. ~~I have made cash deposits of about \$200.00 a year in last two years.~~

Q. 84. Did John Nevilles see you give this money to Robert Harvey?

A. Yes sir. He was right there.

Q. 85. What did Bob. say in the presence of Nevilles while there?

A. He did not say anything. Yes, he said if anything happened we had a witness to the transaction and just as soon as he had dinner he would come right back and bring me the note.

Q. 86. You knew where he lived?

A. Yes sir.

Q. 87 If you ate on the South side-----

A. The last time I was there I ate on the East side

Q. 88. If you ate on the South side you were just two square from his house.

A. I am not positive that we ate there but I think we ate on the East side. I know where he lived. I don't know how far it was but can go there.

Q. 89. What interest was he to pay?

A. *Nothing said*

He paid 8 % on the \$100.00

Q. 90 Did you take a note for that?



A. No sir.

Q. 91. How long did he keep that?

A. He borrowed it for 30 days and kept it 34 or 35 days I don't just remember.

Q. 92. You were in Court after this Neville's continuance was granted that term?

A. I don't remember about that. I was in court at various times.

Q. 93. You say you were not in Danville after that?

A. I don't say I was not. I may have been, but I can't tell you if I was. I may have been to Crawfordsville, or Greencastle in Court and may have been in Danville.

Q. 94. You say you never saw him after that day until he died?

A. I never saw him at all from that day to this.

Q. 95. Did you know he was sick.

A. No sir. Only when the man told me he was dead.

Q. 96. Did you never hear he had an operation performed?

A. No sir.

Q. 97. Never came to his house while he was sick?

A. No sir.

Q. 98. Never got a note.

A. No sir.

Q. 99. Did he write you a letter?

A. Yes sir.

Q. 100. Where is that letter?

A. I think I can find it among my papers.



Q. 101 What was the letter about?

A. It was in regard to this note.

Q. 102. Did you send him a note?

A. No sir, I can tell you what was in that letter.

Q. 103 That would not be evidence --- When did you last see this letter?

A. Not since I received it.

Q. 104 How much money did you have left after giving him this \$260.00.

A. I had two or three dollars in my pocket and some change

Q. 105. How much did you have in Bank?

A. I don't know. I think I have had deposited there about \$300.00 since last October a year ago. I never did business with them before that time.. Before last October a year ago.

Q. 106 How much do you think you had left after you gave him this \$260.00?

A. I think three or four dollars in my pocket and some small change.

Q. 107 When was the loan due?

A. On the 13th. of June.

*I think he would not be sure*

Q. 108 Now then on the second of July, if Bob died on the tenth, you were needing money bad?

A. I think I was. I expect I was trying to get money like every other man who had money out.

Q. 109. Was this lease due at that time?

A. It was due on the 2nd. of July.

Q. 110 What money did you have in Bank along the first of

June? A. I don't know. I had some \$40 or \$50.00 in Bank I think.



Q. 111 Was this your own individual money?

A. Yes sir.

Q. 112. You had that in bank?

A. Yes sir. I have had that money there since last Oct. a year ago for living expenses. It seems to me I wrote you last July something about sending me six dollars that was due. The six dollars that we were talking about this morning.

Q. 113. I will ask you if you did not write me that you had to have money in the week of July 1st?

A. I don't know. If you <sup>will</sup> give me the letter I can answer the question. I think I wrote you once or twice about sending me some money, and I think you ought to pay it.

Q. 114. It was not money that I owed you personally?

A. It was for work you had done.

Q. 115. Work done in the estate of John B. Hankins?

A. It was for work you wrote me to do, and I did it.

Q. 116. You knew it was for the estate of John B. Hankins?

A. I knew it was your business, and I was out that much for expense money.

Q. 117. Well, you needed money very bad that week?

A. I might have told you that I did.

Q. 118. Now I understood you to say that this \$260.00, loan you made Lou Hervey, was to be evidenced by a note to be delivered after dinner?

A. Yes sir.

Q. 119. And you say you never got the note?

A. No sir.



Q. 120 You never got the note at all?

A. No sir.

Q. 121. You made no memoranda of it?

A. I made one a short time after that. I am sure that I did.

Q. 122. And from that date you never saw Robert Hervey alive?

A. No sir. I never saw him from that <sup>day</sup> <sub>x</sub> Never saw him at all I did not know he was dead until after the funeral.

Q. 123. You did not prepare a note to send to him?

A. No sir. He was to prepare the note himself. I wrote him about it and he answered me back.

Q. 124. You never made any demand for this money?

A. I filed a claim.

Q. 125. Did you say anything about it before you filed a claim?

A. No sir. I knew what I had to do in the law and I carried on that part of it.

Q. 126. What amount was still due on the property at this time?

A. I think about \$80.00.

Q. 127. About \$80.00 due when you loaned this \$260.00?

A. I --- No, about \$130 or 140.

Q. 128 Why had you not taken \$140.00 of this money and paid it off?

A. I wanted to get money enough to pay for the house all at one time and then to build an addition to it. I had been very busy, too busy to attend to it. Had not had time to make the trip up there.



Q. 129 Why did ~~not~~ <sup>not</sup> you send a check? You had been sending checks?

A. No sir.

Q. 130 Didn't you say that <sup>you</sup> run this money through the Bank?

\* A. No, I only deposited. My object was this: To get sufficient money to pay for the property all at one time and build an addition to the house. I did not want to pay out \$7.00, a month until I had it paid for and then have to have a law suit to enforce the lease. I wanted to pay out the \$140.00, and build an addition and know that it was mine.

Q. 131 You had that much money?

A. Yes sir.

Q. 132. Now tell me what fees you made at work on or before the 13th. of May?

A. I can't tell you just what I made a short time before. I can tell you what I made in a lump for the last two years. I can give you the whole amount of business, but I can't tell single fees.

Q. 133. Don't you keep a cash account?

A. I do with a few exceptions. I never keep anything under \$2.00. I never keep anything so small as that.

Q. 134. Don't you keep a cash book, showing amounts received and paid out. Cash payable and cash received?

A. I don't keep account of what is paid out. Just keep what money is paid in.

Q. 135. Don't keep account of what you pay out at all?

A. No sir. Not many men do. I know about how business is going. If money is coming in it is going alright, and if not it is not. I can give you the names of parties from whom I



have received fees, if that will do you any good.

Q. 136. I wish you would tell me of fees you have taken in from January 1st. up to the present time?

A. From January 1st. up to the present time?

Q. 137. Yes?

A. I can't give them all to you. I can tell of a partition suit in which I took in \$37.50. It was a \$75.00, fee divided between Mr. Foley and myself.

Q. 138 Give me the fees from January 1st. till now?

A. I have taken in some \$10.00 fees. Taken them here in *30 dollars at Roachdale & 40 at Salem* this court. I can't give the single fees, but I can give you the business in full for two years. *Amounting to \$1300 or \$1400*

Q. 139. I wish you would explain further why you did not want to pay the lease?

A. Why I didn't pay the lease off?

Q. 140. Yes.

A. Well, George I have told you all I can. Told you that I wanted to pay for the house so that I would know it was mine and build an addition to it. I wanted to improve it, but wanted to know that it was mine before I put any more money on it.

Q. 141 This man who held the lease did not have anything to do with the addition?

A. No sir. I wanted to pay for the house and then build the addition. I had the money and if I had gone right and paid it a few days before I would have had a much better house than I have now.

Questioned by Well Masten.

Q. 142 You left here at half past twelve and went home?

A



A. I did not say half past twelve it was between half past twelve and one.

Q. 143 Did Nevilles go with you?

A. I think he went home with me that day. We had been coming in together, and I think we went home together that day. To my best recollection at this time, I think we went home together.

Questioned by Mr. Harvey.

Q. 144. You did not know Bob was dead until after the funeral?

A. I did not know until after then. I had a letter ~~xxxx~~ that I had written him, asking him if he could not send it all to me to send me what he could.
