



Your petitioners, Moses Keeny and Ann Jane

life about the first day of April in the year
eighteen hundred and forty eight, leaving Sally
Irwin his widow and relict, and three children
to wit; your petitioner Ann Jane intermarried
with your petitioner Moses Keeny, ^{and} John and
William, to survive him, who are all the heirs
and legal representatives of said deceased, and
which said John and William are minors under
the age of twenty one years, and all reside in said
County of Hendricks: That said John Irwin
at the time of his death, was seized in fee simple
of and in the following, described real estate situate
in said County, to wit; Lots numbered five, six
and seven in Block numbered fourteen in the
Town of Danville; and lots numbered two, three
and six in Block numbered two in the Town of
Danville, (which said lot numbered two, was by the
said John Irwin leased to one Margaret McPhetridge
for and during her natural life, ~~with~~ conditioned
that the said Margaret shall have the right any time
prior to her decease, to remove from said lot, any
portion of, or all of the improvements put on
said lot by her, and that in case she shall
not remove such improvements prior to her decease,
her heirs shall have the right to remove the same
after the death of the said Margaret.) Also lot
