To the Honorable James M. Clark sole Judge  
of said Court, now in session your orator  
William L. Matlock a citizen of the County  
and State aforesaid humbly complaining  
sheweth unto your Honor that Elizabeth Jenkins  
widow of William Jenkins deceased, late of said  
County, who departed this life on the                      day of  
September 1840 previous to her death, became  
indebted to your orator by an open account  
for goods wares and Merchandise in the sum of  
\$28.27<sup>00</sup> which account is now exhibited and  
marked (A) and made a part of this bill or  
petition, which account is yet due and unpaid  
to your orator; and your orator further  
sheweth unto your Honor that the said  
Elizabeth Jenkins now deceased was also indebted  
to your orator in the further sum of \$10.56<sup>00</sup>  
by note of hand executed by the said Elizabeth  
Jenkins in her lifetime as principal with Charles  
Johnson & Hugh P. Smith as her securities which  
note was executed on the 27th day of October  
1838 and due six months after the date thereof  
exhibited and marked (B) and made a part of this  
petition or bill. Your orator further sheweth to your  
Honor that the aforesaid debt was incurred for  
necessaries in the lifetime of the said Elizabeth  
And your orator would further represent  
to your Honor that the said Elizabeth by the last  
will and testament of her said deceased husband  
William Jenkins was entitled to all his personal estate  
and the proceeds of his real estate during her natural  
life and after her death to descend to Charles Johnson



and Mary Johnson his wife absolute which will  
is exhibited and uncontroverted and made a part of  
this his bill or petition, Your Orator prays that the  
said Charles Johnson and Mary his wife be made  
defendants to this his bill of complaint, and be compelled  
to answer the same under their corporal oaths  
your Orator would further shew unto your  
Honor that there is now remaining in this court the sum  
of sixty seven dollars money paid into court  
by James Sigerson & Hugh P. Smith Administrators  
of said Estate of William Jenkins deceased and  
which by the bequest of the last will and testament  
of the said William Jenkins must descend to the  
said Charles Johnson and his wife Mary after  
paying the just debts of the said Elizabeth Jenkins  
Wherefore your Orator prays your Honor  
to decree in the premises that your Orator  
be paid out of the aforesaid sum of \$67.00  
the sum of \$39.64 the full amount of his  
aforesaid demand against the said Elizabeth  
inclusive of interest up to this date, and that the  
said Charles Johnson and Mary Johnson his wife  
may be enjoined from receiving the aforesaid  
sum of \$67.00 now in the Clerks office  
of this Honorable Court until your Orator  
shall be fully paid and satisfied of his aforesaid  
demand and such other and further decree  
as may seem to your Honor just and right  
and to decree against the said Charles &  
Mary his costs and charges by your Orator  
hereto laid out and expended in the prem-  
ises and that the States most gracious writ  
of subpoena may be issued against the said



Charles Johnson and Mary Johnson his  
wife directed to the Sheriff of said County  
commanding him to summons them to  
personally be and appear in this Honorable  
Court on the first day of their next Term  
to be hereof holden &c And your Obedience
