WHEREAS, *Annie Jenkins* widow of *William P. Jenkins*, deceased, late of said County

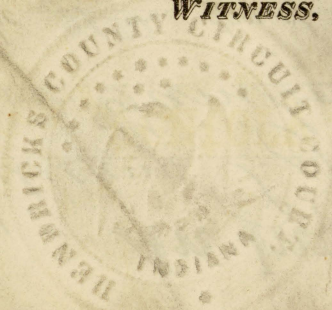
