ESTATE

1826

HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA

Whereas Jonathan Jessop of Hendricks County and State of Indiana
being weak in body and calling to mind that I am mortal, and being of a
disposing mind and memory, think best to make this my last will and
testament, and desire that it may be received by all as such,
first, and principally, I will my soul to God that gave it, and my body to the
earth, to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named
and as touching my worldly goods and Estate, I give and dispose of them in
manner and form following (to wit):
first, It is my Will that all my just debts be paid out of my moveable estate
and that all the balance of my said moveable estate that remains after pay-
ing my just debts, it is my will that it remain on the plantation for the ben-
efit of my beloved wife Sarah and my children namely, Ruth, Lucy, and Rachel
Secondly, It is my Will that my plantation and Land, being the East half of the
North east quarter of Section Number five, and Range two East in township
number fourteen North, continue and remain in possession of my beloved
wife, until my daughter Rachel arrives at the age of eighteen years, on condition
that my wife continue to do a good part by, and for my children, in providing
for them the common necessaries of life until they come to be of age, and
it is my will that when my children come of age, that the said Land be
equally divided between my wife and children above named. and as touching
my Lot Number in the town of Danville, my will is on condition, that if
my Wife Sarah should be delivered of a child, within nine months it is my
Will that the said child inherit the said Lot in Danville provided the Lot
shall, at that time, be considered an equal share with the rest of my children
but, if my wife does not have an heir as before mentioned, it is my will that
the Lot in Danville be sold after my youngest daughter comes of age, and
the money obtained thereby be equally divided between my wife and surviving
children, and as touching the Land whereon I now live, being the East half
of the South west quarter of Section number thirty two in township fifteen
North, and Range two East, I give, bequeath, and demise unto my beloved
wife Sarah. And there is a piece or parcel of Land in North Carolina
Stokes County lying on the Big Creek, given to me in Father's Will, which
is to be mine at my Mother's decease, which piece or parcel of Land, it is my
Will that it be sold after my Mother's decease, and the money obtained
thereby to be equally divided between my wife and all my children.
Lastly, I appoint Elisha Jackson and Samuel Jessop Executors to this my last will and
testament, and hereby revoke, disannul, and make void, all former wills by me made
and hereby declare this to be my last will and testament. in Testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal, this thirtieth day of January, AD. 1826.
