Joseph and Thomas Lockhart, have this day
taken out Letters of Administration on the
Estate of Sarah Joseph deceased, now should
they the above bounden well and truly discharge
their trust as administrators, agreeably
to the Statute in such case made and pro-
vided, and well and truly pay over all monies
which may come into their hands as a
foresaid to the persons entitled by law to demand
and receive the same, then the above obliga-
tion to be void and of none effect, other-
wise to remain in full force and virtue
in law and equity.
