Know ye that the last will and Testament of George Mallock late of the County of said deceased, hath in due form of law been exhibited, proven and recorded in the Clerk's Office in the County of said, a Copy of which is to these presents annexed, Administration therefore of all the goods, and credits of said deceased is hereby granted and committed unto David Mallock, one of the executors by said will appointed, to be by him disposed of agreeably to the Tenor and effect of said Will, Thomas Mallock, the other executor named in said will having refused to serve as such

Copy of George Mallock's Will.

I George Mallock, of the County of Hendricks, and State of Indiana being of sound mind and memory but calling to mind my mortality, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament

Item that it is my will that my beloved son Thomas Mallock, shall have the West half of the North West quarter of Section thirty ^{one}, and the South West

gr of section thirty west half, in Town fifteen range
one west, and the Northeast gr west half of section
nine, Town fifteen range one west together with
all the farming implements and one horse cart, one ri-
fle gun one bed and bedding.

It is my will that my beloved daughter Susan
Matlock, shall have the Northeast gr west half of sec-
tion four, in Town fifteen Range one west,
one bed and bedding.

It is my will that my beloved daughter Nancy
Matlock, shall have the north half of the south frac-
tion of section six in Town fourteen Range one
east one bed and bedding.

And that my beloved daughter Matilda Matlock
shall have the west half of the south west gr of
section five in Town fourteen Range ^{one} east
at the death or marriage of my wife Sally Matlock
and one bed and bedding at her marriage

It is my will that my beloved son George
Matlock have one dollar, and that all my
personal property be equally distributed be-
tween my three daughters except that already
specified.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved
brother David Matlock, and Thomas Mat-
lock executors to execute this my last will
and Testament. In witness whereof I have

day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand
