Second, that after the payment of my debts, it is my Will that my beloved wife Mary Moberly have all the remainder of my estate, both personal and real, and that be ^{she} the absolute owner thereof forever, unless she shall have a posthumous Child; and should such Child be born, then it is my Will that my estate both real and personal shall be equally divided between my said wife and Child. And in case such Child should be born, and afterwards die before arriving at the years of majority, and without either Child or Companion, then it is my will that my said wife have all my Estate as aforesaid.

And lastly it is my Will, that my said wife and her brother Buckner F. Hyatt have the charge and administration of my estate and for that purpose I hereby appoint my said wife Executrix and the Buckner Executors of this my said last will and testament.
