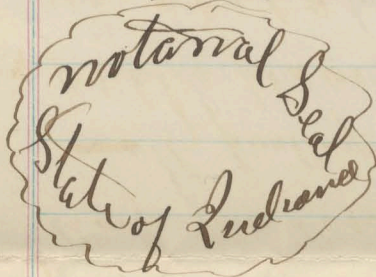

1873 unpaid reversed, not appealed
appealed from and in full force, that after on
the 26th day of August 1873 the said
Browning and Sloan caused an execution in their
favor to issue upon said judgment, and procured
the same to be levied upon the Real Property
above described, ^{who} and after causing the time
and place at which said sale should be made to be
publicly known ~~to be~~ advertised for that day twenty
day, necessarily next before the day of sale,
and by posting up written notices thereof in three
public place in Center Township where said Real Estate
was situated and a like advertisement at the door of
the Court house of the County and also by advertis-
ing the same for three weeks successively in
a newspaper printed nearest to said Real Estate
did sell the same to said Browning and
Sloan for \$ 370 ⁰⁰/₁₀₀ and that said Sheriff



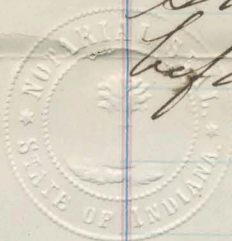

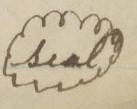
