At this time come the parties by their counsel and the court being sufficiently advised of the premises give the following opinion & judgment, pronounced by Judge Blackford

In this case Hadley filed an account in the Probate Court against Osborn's intestate, & obtained a judgment without the defendant's appearance, or any notice to him of the writ. This judgment cannot be supported.

It is, therefore, considered by the court that the judgment of the Circuit Court be wholly reversed & held for naught, which is ordered to be certified to said court.
