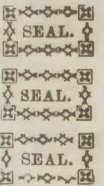

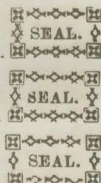

Enos Hadley, guardian of said minor
respectfully shows the Court & reports
that at the time letters were issued to him, his
said ward was the owner of an undivided
 $\frac{1}{2}$ of a Lot in the town of Plainfield
upon which there was situate a two story
frame business house and a mortgage
on the premises of about \$400.00

that the letters of guardianship were taken
to facilitate the sale of said property
for the payment of said encumbrance
by the Administrator of said decedent

That during the pendency of the order
of sale and before a sale could be
made pursuant to the order of Court
the ^{buildings} property was totally destroyed
by fire leaving the vacant lot of
less value than the encumbrance upon
it. That said mortgage has been
filed in this Court & the lot sold
by the Sheriff for a sum less than
the judgment decree — That no estate
whatever ^{of said ward} has come to the possession
or knowledge of this guardian and

and she has no estate depending
upon the settlement of any estate
or the execution of any Trust.

Wherefore

revoke the Letters of guardianship
