I Samuel Owen of the County of Hendricks and State of Indiana, being weak in body but sound in mind and memory, do make and publish this my last Will and testament in manner and form following (to wit),

Item 1st. It is my will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid.

Item 2nd. It is my will that my beloved wife Anna Owen have a sufficiency of my estate to make her comfortable during her natural life and to have her home at our present dwelling according to her will and choice

Item 3rd. It is my will that the heirs of my daughter Sarah Mendenhall (deceased) have one hundred dollars to be divided as follows (to wit), Samuel Mendenhall to have twenty five dollars, David Mendenhall to have twenty five dollars, Richard Mendenhall to have twenty five dollars, Daniel W. Mendenhall to have twenty five dollars.

Item 4th. It is my will that my son John Owen have one dollar over and above what I have already given him.

Item 5th. It is my will that my daughter Mary Easterling have fifty dollars over and above what I have already given her.

Item 6th. It is my will that my son Benjamin Owen have one dollar over and above what I have already given him.

Item 7th. It is my will that my son Samuel Owen have one dollar over and above what I have already given him.

Item 8th. It is my will that my daughter Charity Kinger have one dollar over and above what I have already given her.

Item 9th. It is my will that my son Jonathan Owen have one dollar over and above what I have already given him.

Item 10th. It is my will that my daughter Ann Mendenhall have one dollar over and above what I have all ready given her.

Item 11th. It is my will that my son James Owen have one dollar over and above what I have already given him.

Item 12th. It is my will that my executors hereafter named dispose of such of my property by sale as they and my wife Anna Owen may think necessary not interfering with her comfortable subsistence; and after the decease of my beloved wife (before named) it is my will that the rest and remainder of my estate be equally divided among my children before named.

Item 13th. It is my will, and I hereby appoint my beloved sons John Owen and Samuel Owen executors of this my last will and testament; hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
