this 7th day of March 1838

The condition of the
above obligation is such that whereas the above
bound Edward Strange has this day taken out from
the Clerk of the county of Hendricks (in vacation of
the Probate Court) letters of administration upon
the estate of Rice Payne late of said county deceased
Now if the said Edward Strange will faithfully
discharge the debts and trusts committed to him,
and will promptly deliver and pay to his successor
to be appointed by said probate Court, if any should
ever be appointed, all monies, goods, chattels rights
credits and effects in his hands belonging to said
estate upon reasonable demand, then the
above obligation to be null and void. Otherwise
to be and remain in full force and virtue
in law
