In the name of God, Amen. I Reuben Richards of the county of Hendrix and State of Indiana being weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. First I commit my soul and body to God who gave them, and as to such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to entrust me with I dispose of the same in the manner following. First. I will and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executor and Executrix hereinafter mentioned, as soon after my decease as possible out of any money that may come into their hands from any portion of my Estate whatever. Secondly. I do give and bequeath unto my son George Richards his heirs and assigns, all that my messuage or tenement lying and being in the county of Macon and State of Illinois viz. the West half of the E. C. quarter of Section No fourteen (14) in Township No. twenty (20) North of Range No. three (3) East, containing eighty (80) acres. also the E. W. q. of the N. W. q. of Section No. fifteen (15) in Township No. twenty (20) north of Range three (3) East containing forty (40) acres. also the N. E. q. of the N. W. q. of Section No. fifteen (15) in Township No. twenty (20) north of Range No three (3) East containing forty (40) acres, being in all one hundred and sixty acres, to hold to him the said George Richards his heirs and assigns forever. I do also give and bequeath unto my son George Richards my Rifle gun. I further give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susan Richards, to hold to her during her natural life the farm on which I now live viz. the East half of the N. W. q. of Section No. eleven (11) in Township No fifteen (15) north of Range one (1) west, also the West half of the E. C. q. of Section No eleven (11) in Township No fifteen (15) north of Range one (1) West containing in all one hundred and sixty (160)



acres together with all the rents and emoluments arising therefrom, and at his death I will and Order that said farm of one hundred and sixty acres be equally divided amongst my five daughters viz. Christiana Richards, Nancy Richards, Lucinda Richards, Sarah Jane Richards, and Cynthia Richards. And lastly, as to all the rest, residue and remainder of my personal Estate, goods and chattels of what kind and nature soever, together with the rents or profits accruing from my farm in Illinois during my son George Richards' minority, I give and bequeath unto my said beloved wife Susan Richards to have and to hold for her maintenance, and for the sufficient Education and maintenance of my six children, above named, untill they shall arrive at lawfull age: and I hereby appoint my said beloved wife Susan Richards executrix and my brother in law John Baker executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty seventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine
