Said Ruth Rigney died October 1<sup>st</sup> 1852 the owner of Bounty Land Warrant No. 73048 for forty acres of land issued to said Ruth Rigney on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of September 1852 and said Warrant descended to the heirs of said decedent who sold the same, but were unable to make a valid assignment thereon to the purchaser; and letters of administration were issued to this adm'r. to enable him to properly execute said assignment. That he has executed said assignment according to the requirements of the law. That no assets have come into his hands to be administered and he knows of no assets belonging thereto.
