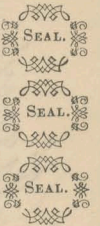

H. S. McCormack, admr. of the estate of Ruth Rigney decd. reports to the Court of Common Pleas of said County, the following final settlement account in said estate. Said Ruth Rigney died October 1st 1852 the owner of Bounty Land Warrant No. 73048 for forty acres of land issued to said Ruth Rigney on the 14th day of September 1852 and said Warrant descended to the heirs of said decedent who sold the same, but were unable to make a valid assignment thereon to the purchaser; and letters of administration were issued to this admr. to enable him to properly execute said assignment; that he has executed said assignment according to the requirements of the law, that no assets have come into his hands to be administered and he knows of no assets belonging thereto, that he knows of no indebtedness to or from said estate. He has paid off all the fees and expenses of administration, and files receipts therefor herewith. He therefore asks to be discharged from any further duties or liabilities on account of said trust.
