To Walter Davis, and Daudridge Tucker of said County, Greeting:

Whereas, Sarah Scott Widow and relict of Reuben M. Scott deceased, having filed her affidavit to the effect that all of the property, both personal and real, of the said decedent, will not amount to the sum of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS, exclusive of incumbrances, and ask that the property be appraised.
