pleased God to entrust me with, I dispose of
the same in the following manner to wit: I direct,
first, that all my just debts and funeral expenses
be paid as soon after my decease as possible,
out of the first moneys that shall come to hand
of my executor, from any portion of my estate,
real or personal. I also direct that a fair valuation
or appraisement be made by three judicious
neighbors; ~~of all~~ ~~at~~ ~~my~~ I have given to my
daughter Mary Bales one bed and bedding and one
cow and calf and six sheep and one ~~yearling~~ colt
at weaning time, I have ~~also~~ also given to
my son George one horse beast worth twenty
dollars, as to the property that he has acquired by
his own exertions I have no claims upon what
ever I now direct that all my children be made
equal with Mary Bales in property or money.
I direct that my land shall not be sold until
the youngest child becomes of age unless it is
necessary to pay the debts, I wish them to live
on the farm and keep house as long as they can
agree, I wish my ~~children~~ children to make
their own contracts with the advice of their
~~friends~~ and Council of their friends. I direct
that if my children can not agree to live on the
farm together, that it shall be rented and the
rents applied as far as they see say to the keeping
farm in repair and that the fields be changed
and put in clover. I also direct that after the
youngest child becomes of age that the place

Shall be sold and equally divided between
my children share and share alike; And I
hereby make and ordain my worthy and esteemed
friend, John Richardson, executor of this my
last will and Testament;
