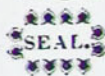

George W. Chaplin who has intermarried with Mary M. Chaplin one of the heirs of & at law of the estate of Hugh P. Smith dec'd. after being first duly sworn upon his oath says that he has been informed and verily believes it to be true that William Worrell Adair of the Estate aforesaid, both in violation of his trust as such Administrator, collected and received moneys belonging to said Estate amounting to some two or three hundred dollars and both loaned the same out to individuals and not paid the same into this court and both paid out of moneys belonging to said Estate amounting to some two hundred dollars, on claims or demands not due and owing from said Estate one of which payments was made to one John W.
