The memorial of Henry Stewart, guardian of the person and estate of Hugh Stewart, respectfully sheweth; that the said Hugh Stewart is a minor within the age of twenty one years, and is an heir at law of Hugh Goudy late of said County and State of Indiana deceased, who died seized in fee of the following real estate situate in said County of Hendricks, and described as follows, to wit, The South west quarter, and the South west quarter of the North west quarter, of Section twenty two in Township Sixteen North of Range One east, containing in all two hundred ~~dollar~~ acres of land; that the said Hugh Stewart is as such heir the owner in fee simple by inheritance, of the undivided one tenth part of said lands, ^{subject to the right of dower therein of the widow of said Hugh Goudy deceased.} And that said premises are well improved.





Goudy, at private sale, the following real estate, situate in Hendricks County, Indiana, to wit: The undivided one tenth part of the South west quarter and the South west quarter of the North west quarter of section twenty two in township sixteen north of Range One east, subject to the dower right therein of the widow of Hugh Goudy deceased, for the sum and price of two hundred and seventy four dollars, to secure which sum the said Samuel D. Goudy ~~has~~ together with Hugh H.
