the trusts committed to him as GUARDIAN of the ~~person~~ and estate of *James H. Summers*
Daniel T. Summers and William C. Summers heirs to the
Estate of *Cornelius Summers*
deceased, during the minority of the said *James, Daniel T. and William*
C. Summers
and render to this Court a just and true account of his said guardianship, when he shall be thereunto
required, then the above obligation is to be void and of none effect, otherwise to be and remain in full force
