of five hundred dollars for the payment  
of which well and truly to be made  
and done we bind ourselves our heirs  
executors and administrators jointly and  
severally firmly by these presents.  
Sealed with our seals and dated this  
8<sup>th</sup> day of November A. D 1841.

The condition of the above obligation  
is such that if the above bound Jeremiah  
Johnson will truly and faithfully perform  
the duties and trusts committed to him  
as guardian of the persons and estates of  
William Thornbrough & Clark Thornbr-  
ough according to law, then the above  
obligation is to be void and of none ef-  
fect, otherwise to be and remain  
in full force and virtue in law
