Whereas I have received from the citizens along the line of a contemplated Railroad from the City of Indianapolis Indiana by the way of Crawfordsville and Covington to Danville Illinois subscriptions of donations to aid me in constructing a Railroad between the points aforesaid, and I having abandoned the construction of said Railroad and having the written request of a large majority of the committee with whom I have been in negotiation in relation to said Railroad, and by whom said subscriptions of donations were placed in my hands to assign the said donations to the Indianapolis Crawfordsville & Danville Railroad Company. Now therefore in pursuance of said request I for value received do hereby assign, transfer and set over to the said Indianapolis, Crawfordsville & Danville Railroad Company all of the said subscriptions of donations without any recourse on me

Henry C. Lord having assigned the subscriptions of Donations to the Indianapolis Crawfordsville & Danville Railroad Company That company on the 16th day of April 1868 entered into a written contract with Bery E. Smith and associates for the construction of said Railroad as specified in the subscription Papers from In-

Indianapolis to Danville in Illinois and amongst other things agreed to transfer and assign to the said Ben E. Smith and associates all subscriptions of donations made by any individual City town or County to aid in constructing the said Railroad and the Railroad company did afterwards deliver and transfer the said subscriptions to B. E. Smith & associates who now hold and are the bona fide owners of the same

The Railroad company having caused the road to be constructed from Indianapolis to the town of Crawfordville and regular trains of cars now running thereon, the terms of the contract being complied with, B. E. Smith and associates ask for the payment of such part of the said subscription of Jas D. Trotter as by its terms has become due

We whose names are hereunto subscribed bind ourselves severally to pay to Henry C. Lord or his assigns the sums severally placed opposite our names without any relief from valuation or appraisement Laws provided said Henry C. Lord or his assigns shall construct or cause to be constructed a Railroad running from the City of Indianapolis Indiana to the Town of Danville Illinois by way of Brownburg, Pittsboro, Elizabethtown Jamestown, Crawfordville, Covington to Danville aforesaid one half to be paid when said Railroad is completed to the town of Crawfordville the balance to be paid when the Railroad is completed and in running order to the aforesaid town of Danville

And we further agree to procure the right of way of said Railroad from the west line of Marion County to the aforesaid Danville Illinois as witness our hands this the 1st day of April 1865
