William Crabb, Henry E. Green, William
G. Vaughan are held & firmly bound unto the
State of Indiana in the sum of ~~four~~^{Eight} hundred
dollars. for the payment of which well and
truly to be made & done we bind ourselves
our heirs, Executors & administrators. jointly
& severally firmly by these presents. sealed
with our seals. & dated this 14th day of May
1844.

The Condition of the above obligation
is such that if the said William Crabb
will faithfully the duties committed to his
trust as Guardian of the persons & estates
of John W. Vaughan & Joseph Vaughan minor
heirs of the estate of John P. Vaughan de-
ceased then the above obligation is to be
void and of none effect. Otherwise to be
& remain in full force & virtue in law.

William Crabb Guardian of the person and estate of Joseph Vaughan, late a minor, Reports, that said Joseph has now arrived at the age of twenty one years. And that for the purpose of settling said Guardianship with this Court, said Guardian now makes the following exhibit of his receipts and expenditures as such guardian, to wit:

Said Guardian charges himself with the sum of \$227.97 which is the whole amount of personal property belonging to said Joseph, including interest on money loaned, which has ever come to his hands as such Guardian.

And said Guardian claims credit for the following amounts, paid out for expenses of Guardianship, for benefit of said Joseph, and retained for services ^{as} guardian, And for amount paid said Joseph upon his arriving at the age of twenty one years; To wit:
