this my last will and testament in manner and form following
that is to say. First I give and bequeath unto my son Jonathan
White one feather bed. Second I give and bequeath unto my
son John White one feather bed. Third I give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Susannah Wilson one Corner Cupboard
and one Bureau. Fourth I give & bequeath unto Martha Chamney
Hannah Beard & Susannah Wilson my Daughters two bed quilts
each, & also four blankets & two Coverlets to my daughter Susannah
Wilson. I also give & bequeath unto my son Jonathan White one
Clock & case & also one Clock to my son John White. I give and
bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Chamney one puter basin
& three books and to Hannah Beard my Daughter one large puter
dish & two puter plates & also to Susannah Wilson my Daughter one
small puter dish & two puter plates I also give & bequeath to Priscilla
Viles my Daughter Sarah Viles deceased's Daughter one puter basin
And lastly I give & bequeath all the money that may be on
hand at my death & all Notes that may be in my possession
