Hendricks in the State of Indiana, being of sound
mind and disposing memory, do make and
publish this my last will and testament, hereby
revoking all former wills by me at any time
heretofore made.

Item 1st. It is my will that all my just debts
and funeral expenses be paid out of my
Estate.

Item 2nd. I hereby give and bequeath to my children
John White, Polly Woodard, Nancy Hockett
and Dorcas Ramsey each the sum of five Dollars
and also to my Daughters Margaret Bowles
and Lydia Bowles each the sum of five Dollars
and also to the heirs of my son Joel White
and my daughter Rebecca Worth, the like
sum of five Dollars, the said sum of five
Dollars to be paid by my Executor to the guardian
of said heirs if there should be one appointed, or
in case there is no guardian then the said sum
to be paid to Cynthia White for the heirs of Joel
White, and Thomas Worth for the heirs of Rebecca
Worth, and it is further my will that as I
now have a promissory note on my son
Sugan White, that his said note be surrende-
red, released, and given up to him in lieu
of his portion as above bequeathed to my other
children.

Item 3^d. I hereby give and bequeath to my Dear
wife Lydia White all the residue of my
Estate both real and personal to have
and to hold the same at her own free
will and disposal, hereby authorizing
and empowering her to sell and
