I Elizabeth Wilson of Hendricks County and State of Indiana being of disposing memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life do make and ordain this my last Will and testament

First. and principally, I Will my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be decently and plainly buried at the discretion of my executor hereafter named

2nd As touching my worldly estate it is my Will that my Daughters Esther Wilson and Mary Wilson have one hundred dollars each, so soon as all my just debts and funeral charges are paid. Also that they have one Feather and bed-ding each.

3rd I will unto my Daughters Dinah Wilson and Indiana Wilson one hundred dollars each on their arrival at the age of eighteen years; or if they <sup>or either of them</sup> should marry before their arrival at eighteen years, it is my will that they have it at that time also that they have one Feather bed and bedding each or if they should choose money instead, it is my Will that they beds be sold and they have an equivalent in money equal to the value of the beds given to Esther and Mary.

4th It is my will that the balance of my property be sold and the proceeds of the sale with all other assets which may come into the hands of my executor, be equally divided between my aforesaid children, namely, Esther Wilson Mary Wilson Dinah Wilson and Indiana Wilson
