when completed, you will return, together with this precept, to this office.

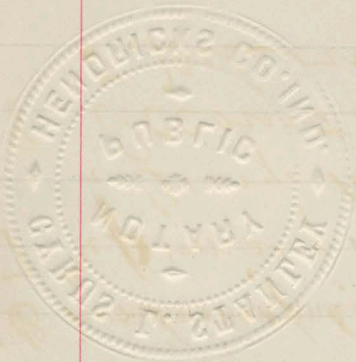
